#### Factory fitted moulded mains plug



## System connections


Make connections as shown below. When connecting the related system components, refer also to the instruction manuals of the related components.

Caution: Do not plug in the power lead until all connections are completed.

#### Malfunction of microcomputer

If operation is not possible or erroneous diplay appears even though all connections have been made properly, reset the microcomputer referring to "In case of difficulty".

#### Basic connection



#### Caution regarding placement

To maintain proper ventilation, be sure to leave a space around the unit (from the largest outer dimensions including projections) equal to, or greater than, shown below.

Left and right panels: 10 cm

Rear panel: 10 cm

- 1. Connect all cords firmly. If connections are loose, there could be loss of sound or noise produced.
- 2. When plugging and unplugging connection cords, be sure to first remove the power cord from the AC outlet. Plugging/unplugging connection cords without removal of the power cord can cause malfunctions or damage to the unit.

#### **ABOUT THE SYSTEM CONTROL CONNECTIONS**

Connecting system control cords after connecting a KENWOOD audio componet system lets you take advantage of convenient system control operations.

There are two KENWOOD system control modes. Make connections according to the groups of terminal symbols shown below.


[XS8] Mode: lets you combine [X7], [X5], and [X58] terminals

[SL16] Mode: for [SL] terminals only

This unit is [XS8] compatible but it can be converted to the [SL16] mode through servicing. Consult your nearest retailer or the Kenwood Marketing Department for more information about "SWITCHING FROM [XS8] TO [SL16]".

#### Notes:

- (SL16) equipment cannot be combined with [XR], [XS], and [XS8] equipment
  for system operations. If your equipment consists of this kind of
  combination, please do not connect any system control cords. Even without
  system control cords, normal operations can be carried out without affecting
  performance.
- If your amplifier or receiver does not have a system control terminal, do not connect any system control cords to the system control terminals on the other components.
- Do not connect system control cords to any components other than those specified by KENWOOD. It may cause a malfunction and damage your equipment.
- 4. Be sure the system control plugs are inserted all the way in to the system control terminals



#### **ABOUT THE SYSTEM CONTROL OPERATIONS**

#### **Remote Control**

Lets you operate this unit with the system remote supplied with the amplifier or receiver.

#### Automatic Operation (except [XR] equipment)

Automatically switches the input selector on the amplifier or receiver when you start playback from this unit.

#### Synchronized Recording (except [XR] equipment)

Lets you synchronize recording with the start of playback when recording from CD. Also the simple CCRS operation lets you make great recordings from CD.

See the instruction manual supplied with your cassette deck for details.

#### **SWITCHING FROM [XS8] TO [SL16]**

You can easily change the system control mode with the following operation. Do this operation after completing all connections.


Switching to [SL16]: Hold down the ►► key and switch the POWER key from OFF to ON.

Switching back to [XS8]: Hold down the I◄◄ key and switch the POWER key from OFF to ON.

(Performing the "To erase program files" operation on page 19, switches the system control mode back to [XS8]. Be sure to reset the system control mode.)


## ■ Connection to digital components (DP-R6080 only)

The DIGITAL OUTPUT OPTICAL jack converts the digital codes of the audio signal into light signals for output. Connect this unit with a commercial optical fiber cable to the OPTICAL INPUT jack of a DAT, an MD recorder, etc.



#### Optical fiber cable connection

- When using an optical fiber cable to connect this unit to a digital amplifier, insert the plug straight into the jack until a snap sound is heard.
- 2. Be careful not to bend, coil, or bundle the optical fiber cable.
- Optical fiber cables available on the market may not always be able to be used with this player. If your cord cannot be used with this unit, consult the store from which you purchased the cord or your nearest dealer.




#### Connection for relay play

By connection to a separately sold KENWOOD 100-disc changer (DP-J series "DP-J1070", "DP-J2070", etc.), this unit can be used for relay play (continuous play for a long time).

For execution of relay play, connect the connection cords to the DP-J series.


#### About the STANDBY mode of the POWER switch


When the power cord of this unit is plugged into an AC outlet, a small amount of current is being supplied to the unit to back up the memory contents even when the power is turned off. This is called the STANDBY mode.







- 1. The supplied batteries are intended for use in operation checks. Therefore, their lives may be shorter than ordinary batteries.
- 2. When the remote-controllable distance gets shorter than before, replace both batteries with new ones.
- 3. Malfunction may occur if direct sunlight or the light of a high-frequency lighting fluorescent lamp enters the remote control light sensor. In such a case, change the system installation position to prevent the malfunction.

## Programmed play (PGM mode)

The program mode allows you to play desired tracks in the order you want to hear them. A maximum of 32 selections can be entered in memory.

Press the stop key.




#### Auto-Space function


In the program mode, a space of several seconds is inserted automatically between the programmed tracks (only for music CDs). This function is provided to facilitate the DPSS function of the cassette deck. However, such a space may also be inserted in case the sound of two tracks are continued, for example with some classic music and live recordings.








#### **About TIME DISPLAY**

Press the TIME DISP, key when you want to check the elapsed time and remaining time of the track being played. Every time the TIME DISP. key is pressed, the displayed time changes as shown below.

However, only the display ① and ② will be displayed during random play and programmed play.




## Editing (EDIT)

Normal EDIT: Edit from one disc.

MULTI EDIT: Edit and record from several discs.

#### Normal EDIT

This function is for editing when you are recording the contents of a CD onto a tape. It is to ensure that the final track on each side of the tape is fully recorded and that the possible recording time on the tape will be fully used.










#### Notes:

- 1. While you can edit with a different time setting to that of the tape you are using, part of the tape may be left with nothing recorded on it, or the last track on side A or side B may be cut short.
- 2. The EDIT function may not operate properly for discs having only one track or having tracks of long duration such as classical music.

#### ■ MULTI EDIT

Several CDs can be edited and recorded on 1 tape. Choose songs from each disc, and edit/record while cofirming the remaining time on files A and B, respectively.





Input the recording time of the tape.



- By pressing the TIME DISP, key the set time-length intervals will change in this order: 46→54→60→90→ --
- When "--" is displayed, the interval length can be adjusted with the skip keys [ and in units of one minute (to a maximum of 99 minutes).





- When the time left on side A is less than the play time of the selected song, that song will be programmed on side B.
- If "b-FULL" is displayed, no further programming can be accepted.

#### Start recording.

When recording with a cassette deck equipped with **CCRS** function:

Press the CCRS key.



- With the CCRS function, the recording starts after about 1 minute.
- If you have a cassette deck capable of Double-speed recording. use Normal-speed recording.


When recording with a normal cassette deck:

- ① Adjust the recording levels.
- 2 Press the record key.
- 3 Play the CD.

When recording the 2nd and 3rd discs, repeat steps 4-6.


• Change discs and, if the "b-01" indication is given when you first select a song, turn the tape to the start of side B.

Recording occurs as shown below (example when three CDs are to be recorded).



## Program file (DP-R6080 only)

The programmed contents of up to 100 discs can be stored in the program file (up to 16 songs per disc). Your favorite songs can be selected and played in order.



#### To create a program file

Preparation: Confirm that PGM FILE is OFF ("FILE" indicator is extinguished).

Select 1 disc and program your favorite songs.

Refer to page 12. (Steps 1 – 3 can be completed.)


- Up to 16 tracks can be programmed per disc.
- Programming spanning between discs cannot be recorded on the program file.
- Store the program in a program file.



To change to another program file:

Press P. MODE once and extinguish the PGM indicator. Then press P. MODE again and repeat steps 1 and 2.

When a program has been stored, the "FILE" indicator stops blinking and starts to light steadily.



When 100 files have been programmed in the program file, "FULL" is displayed.

## ■ Playing a program file

Preparation: Press the key.

#### Make sure the PGM indicator is extinguished.



#### Press the PGM FILE key.





#### Select the disc you want to play.



 Discs without a recorded program file will start to playback from the first track.

#### ■ To erase program files

#### Erasing one specific program file

- ① Make sure the PGM indicator is extinguished.
- ② Confirm that PGM FILE is OFF ("FILE" indicator is extinguished). \_\_\_\_\_
- 3) Press the PGM FILE key.
- Select the disc with the program file you want to erase.
- After confirming that the PGM indicator is illuminated, press the late.
- 6 Press the CLEAR key.
- If you want to erase another program file, repeat steps ① ~ ⑤.

#### Erasing all program files


- Switch the power OFF.
- ② Turn the power ON while holding the CLEAR key depressed.





 If the mode of the system control connection is set to [SL16], it returns to [XS8]. Try the setting again.

#### Disc handling precautions



Hold compact discs so that you do not touch the playing surface.



#### Cleaning

If fingerprints or foreign matter become attached to the disc, lightly wipe the disc with a soft cotton cloth (or similar) from the center of the disc outwards in a radial manner.



Do not attach paper or tape to either the playing side or the label side of compact discs.



#### Storage

When a disc is not to be played for a long period of time, remove it from the CD player and store it in its case.

#### Caution on disc used





#### Never play a cracked or warped disc.

During playback, the disc rotates at high speed in the player. Therefore, to avoid danger, never use a cracked or deformed disc or a disc repaired with tape or adhesive agent.

#### Discs which can be played with this unit

#### CD (12 cm, 8 cm), CDV (only the audio part)

With CD-G (CD Graphics) discs, this unit can play only the audio.

#### Note related to transportation and movement

Before transporting or moving this unit, carry out the following opera-

- 1. Turn the power ON but do not load a disc.
- 2. Wait a few seconds and verify that the display shown appears. Wait future a few seconds.
- Turn the power OFF.



#### Beware of condensation

When water vapor comes into contact with the surface of cold material, water drops are produced.

If condensation occurs, correct operation may not be possible, or the unit may not function correctly.

This is not a malfunction, however, the unit should be dried.

(To do this, turn the POWER switch ON and leave the unit as it is for several hours.)


Be specially careful in the following conditions.

- When the unit is brought from a cold place to a warm place, and there is a large temperature difference.
- When a heater starts operating
- When the unit is brought from an air-conditioned place to a place of high temperature with high humidity.
- When there is a large difference between the internal temperature of the unit and ambient temperature, or in conditions where condensation occurs easily.

## Timer operation

The unit has the timer stand-by function.

With this function and commercially-available audio timer, playback can be started at the desired time.



Note:

When operating the unit other than CD player using an audio timer, be sure to remove the disc from the CD player.

## In case of difficulty

What appears to be a malfunction may not always be serious. If your unit should not perform as expected, consult the table below to see if the problem can be corrected before seeking help from your dealer or service representative.

#### Operation to reset

The microcomputer may fall into malfunction (impossibility to operate, erroneous display, etc.) when the power cord is unplugged while power is ON or due to an external factor. In this case, execute the following method to reset the microcomputer and return it to normal condition.

Unplug the power cord from the power socket and plug the power cord into the socket again.

- Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

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
