- Some operations and displays may differ slightly, depending on the model you use.
- "DVD" may be used as a general term for DVD VIDEOs, DVD+RWs/DVD+Rs and DVD-RWs/ DVD-Rs.
- The meaning of the icons used in this manual is described below:

Features

The CDP-NW10/DVP-NW50 (referred to as the Unit in this manual) is a home audio component system based on network connections. A Unit is installed into the wall of a room and connected to other Units using an Ethernet connection (100Base-TX.)

The system consists of:

- Up to 12 Units (CDP-NW10 or DVP-NW50)
- A personal computer (if necessary)
- Audio output components, such as a CD Changer
- A monitor or a projector (DVP-NW50)
- Two speakers (2CH) (CDP-NW10)/Five speakers and a sub woofer (5.1CH) (DVP-NW50)

The main features of the Unit are the following:

- Two types of conventional CD player model and a DVD player model with a simple timer clock and 2ch audio input
- The Unit can play back MP3-format audio files stored on a computer via a network (An exclusive application of PC is needed)
- The Unit can play back CDs mounted in other Units via a network
- The Unit can play back the audio contents in all the rooms simultaneously from the following sources (Party mode)
 - CDs in any Units
 - MP3 discs (DVP-NW50 only) and LINE IN in the lead operating Unit
 - FM or AM tuner
 - MP3-format audio files stored on a computer (a Playlist feature in the Unit is available)
- INTERCOM and MONITOR functions via a network
- 2ch to 5.1ch sound produced from connected speakers for DVP-NW50, or 2ch sound produced from connected speakers for CDP-NW10

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
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CDP-NW10/DVP-NW50 system network

Note about CD-R/CD-RW/DVD-R/DVD-RW (Video mode)/DVD+R/DVD+RW

In some cases, CD-R/CD-RW/DVD-R/DVD-RW (Video mode)/DVD+R/DVD+RW cannot be played on the Unit due to the recording quality or physical condition of the disc, or the characteristics of the recording device and authoring software. The disc will not play if it has not been correctly finalized. For more information, see the operating instructions of the recording device. Note that discs created in the Packet Write format cannot be played.

Music discs encoded with copyright protection technologies

This product is designed to play back discs that conform to the Compact Disc (CD) standard. Recently, various music discs encoded with copyright protection technologies are marketed by some record companies. Please be aware that among those discs, there are some that do not conform to the CD standard and may not be playable by this product.

Note on DualDisc

A DualDisc is a two sided disc product which mates DVD recorded material on one side with digital audio material on the other side.

However, since the audio material side does not conform to the Compact Disc (CD) standard, playback on this product is not guaranteed.

Note on playback operations of DVDs and VIDEO CDs

Some playback operations of DVDs and VIDEO CDs may be intentionally set by software producers. Since this Unit plays DVDs and VIDEO CDs according to the disc contents the software producers designed, some playback features may not be available. Also, refer to the instructions supplied with the DVDs or VIDEO CDs.

Region code

This Unit is designed and manufactured to respond to the Region Management information that is recorded on a DVD VIDEO. The region code of this Unit is "1."

This Unit will play DVD VIDEO labelled (m) or (m)

If you try to play any other DVD VIDEO, the message "wrong region" will appear on the TV screen. Depending on the DVD VIDEO, there may be no region code indication, even though playing the DVD VIDEO is prohibited by area restrictions.

Chapter 1 Getting Started


This chapter provides you with information how to connect and setup the Unit.

Setting up the System

Your system has already been installed by an installer. If you want to change the configuration, the TV or the audio equipment, check the location of the VIDEO out jack, the LINE IN jack, and the IR IN/OUT jack. Contact your nearest installer for details on the connections required by the system.


Connecting a TV (DVP-NW50 only)

Connections between the Unit and each device are made via cables or cords coming through the wall. Connect the VIDEO OUT of the Unit to a TV. Select one of the ways of connection methods shown below, according to the input jack on your TV.



Note

Do not connect a VCR, etc., between your TV and the Unit. If you pass the Unit signals via the VCR, you may not receive a clear image on the TV screen. If your TV has only one video input jack, connect the Unit to this jack.



Connecting audio Equipment

Connections between the Unit and each of devices are made via cables or cords coming through the wall. The Unit can input sound from external audio equipment via the audio connectors on the Unit. Connect the OUTPUT jacks (L/R) of the audio equipment to the LINE IN (L/R) jacks of the Unit using the proper audio cords (optional).



Selecting a method for using the remote

Connections between the Unit and each device are made via cables or cords coming through the wall. You can operate a component using the remote if the IR IN/OUT terminal of the Unit and the component are connected. For example, if you connect IR IN of the Unit and IR OUT of a TV, you can operate the Unit with the Remote by aiming it at the TV.

 Press the "▼" SELECT on the HOME Menu, then press the "SETUP" SELECT. The Setup Menu appears.

Setting an IP Address

There are two ways to acquire an IP address. The default setting is underlined.

Setting up the Units

- <u>AUTO</u>: You can acquire the IP address automatically. Normally, select this setting.
- MANUAL: You can set up the IP address manually. Because some knowledge of networking is required to use this setting, we recommend you normally to select "AUTO."
- Press the "▼" SELECT on the HOME Menu, then press the "SETUP" SELECT. The Setup Menu appears.

Preparing the remote

Insert two R06 (size-AA) batteries into the battery compartment with the + and – correctly oriented to the markings. When using the remote, point it at the IR sensor **I** on the Unit.




Notes

- Under normal conditions, the batteries should last for about six months. When the remote no longer operates the Unit, replace both batteries with new ones.
- Do not leave the remote in an extremely hot or a humid place.
- Do not drop any foreign object into the remote casing, particularly when replacing the batteries.
- · Do not use a new battery with an old one.
- Do not expose the IR sensor to direct sunlight or lighting equipment. Doing so may cause a malfunction.
- If you do not intend to use the remote for an extended period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery leakage and corrosion.

Setting a remote code on the remote

You can switch the remote code (CIS2 or CIS3) on the remote. If the remote code of the Unit and the remote are different, you cannot use the remote to operate the Unit. Make sure that the remote code of the remote and the Unit is the same. For details on setting a remote code on the Unit, see page 13.



Press the (A) or (B) SELECT while "RM SETUP" is being pressed on the remote.

The default setting is CIS2.

When you press the (A) SELECT, remote code is set to CIS2.


When you press the ^(B) SELECT, remote code is set to CIS3.

You cannot operate the Unit using the remote when the remote code of the Unit and the remote are different.

Menu operation

The Home Menu is displayed on the Unit (④). Using the Home Menu, you can select the sound and make various adjustments to items.



Using any SELECT (B), you can select an item on the front panel display.

When the item is displayed on the left side, press a SELECT on the left side.

When the item is displayed on the right side, press a SELECT on the right side.

When you want to see items below those currently displayed, press the "^(h)" SELECT.




Chapter 3 Playing Discs

(CDP-NW10 only)

This chapter describes how to play a CD disc or how to play audio in various modes using the CDP-NW10.

Playing a CD Disc

- **1** Press I/() (POWER). The Unit turns on.
- **2** Press OPEN/CLOSE to open the door, then place a disc on the spindle firmly.



- **3** Press OPEN/CLOSE. The door closes.
- 4 Press the "CD" SELECT on the Home Menu. The track list appears on the front panel display. When the Unit has been connected to the Internet via a computer, the track titles are downloaded from the Gracenote CDDB[®] server, and the track titles appear on the front panel display. You can select and play back desired tracks from these lists. When the Unit is not connected to a computer or your computer is not connected to the Internet, only "TRACK1," "TRACK2," etc., appear on the front panel display.
- 5 Press ►.

When CD information is downloaded from Gracenote CDDB[®], you can also press the "TRACK" SELECT.

To stop playing a disc

Press **I**.

Additional operations

Mute the sound	MUTING. To cancel muting, press it again or press VOLUME + to adjust the sound volume.
Select a track number	Numeric buttons (0-9). When the track number is between 1 and 9: press the corresponding numeric button, then press ►. When the track number is 10 or higher: press the corresponding numeric buttons in sequence. e.g.: Playback of the 14th track Press 1 → 4 in order.

Note

If there is no disc in the Unit or a disc that cannot be read by the Unit, "NO DISC" appears on the front panel display.





Playing a CD Disc

- **1** Press I/() (POWER). The Unit turns on.
- **2** Press OPEN/CLOSE to open the door, then place a disc on the spindle firmly.



- **3** Press OPEN/CLOSE. The door closes.
- 4 Press the "DVD" SELECT on the Home Menu. The track list appears on the front panel display. When the Unit has been connected to the Internet via a computer, the track titles are downloaded from the Gracenote CDDB® server, and the track titles appears on the front panel display. You can select and play back desired tracks from these lists. When the Unit is not connected to a computer or your computer is not connected to the Internet, only "TRACK1," "TRACK2," etc., appear on the front panel display.
- 5 Press ►.

When CD information is downloaded from Gracenote CDDB[®], you can also press the "TRACK" SELECT.

To stop playing a disc

Press I twice.

Additional operations



The Unit starts playback.

Using the DVD's menu DVD-V

A DVD is divided into long sections of a movie or a music feature called "titles."

When you play DVDs which contains several titles, you can select the title using the TOP MENU on the remote. When you play DVDs that allow you to select items such as language for the sound and subtitles, select these items using the MENU on the remote.

- 1 Press TOP MENU or MENU on the remote. The disc menu appears on the TV screen. The contents of the menu differ from disc to disc.
- 2 Press ☆/ở on the remote to select the item you want to play or change.
- **3** Press ENTER on the remote.

Playing VIDEO CDs with PBC functions (VIDEO CD Ver. 2.0 or higher) VCD

PBC (PlayBack Control) allows you to play VIDEO CDs interactively by following the menu on the TV screen.

- Press ►.
 If you insert a VIDEO CD (Ver.2.0 or higher), the VIDEO CD starts playing with PBC functions.
 The menu used by your selection appears.
- **2** Press the numeric buttons on the remote to select the item number you want.
- **3** Press ENTER on the remote.
- 4 Follow the instructions on the menu for interactive operations.

Refer to the instructions supplied with the disc, as the operating procedure may differ, depending on the VIDEO CD.

Note

Depending on the VIDEO CD, "Press ENTER on the remote" in step 3 may appear as "Press SELECT" in the instructions supplied with the disc. In this case, press ►.

Chapter 4 Playing Discs (DVP-NW50 only)

Searching for a Scene

Playing an MP3 audio track DATA CD

You can play MP3 audio tracks on CD-ROMs, CD-Rs, or CD-RWs. However, the discs must be recorded according to ISO9660 level 1, or Joliet format for the Unit to recognize the tracks.

1 Insert a data disc recorded in MP3 format into the Unit. A folder list is displayed on the TV screen.



2 Press ☆/∜ to select the folder you want to play, then press ENTER on the remote. File list is appears under the folder.



3 Press ☆/∜ to select the file you want to play, then press ENTER on the remote.

The Unit starts playing the first MP3 audio track on the disc.

Notes

- The Unit can play MP3 (MPEG1 Audio Layer3) audio. The Unit cannot play audio tracks in MP3PRO format.
- If an MP3 file of VBR (variable bit rate) is played, indicated the elapsed time may be different from the actual time.
- If you add the extension ".MP3" to data that is not in MP3 format, the Unit cannot recognize the data properly and will generate a loud noise which could damage your speakers.
- You can enter up to 50 characters as a file name including an extension.
- A file or folder name that is not based on the ISO level 1 or Joliet format may not be displayed properly.
- The total number of file or folder names should be 128, or fewer.
- There should be no more than 128 levels in the folder tree.
- Do not use characters such as <, >, &, \mid , ", /, ?, *, ', \backslash :, etc.

Searching for a particular point on a disc (Search/Scan) DVD-V VCD CD

You can quickly locate a particular point on a disc by monitoring the picture or playing it back slowly.

Note

Depending on the disc, you may not be able to do some of the operations described here.

To locate a point quickly using the previous/next buttons (Search)

You can search for the next or previous chapter, track, or scene using | 4 | / > | on the Unit.

Press I or ►► lightly once to go to the next or previous chapter/track/scene during playback.

To locate a point quickly by playing a disc in fast forward or fast reverse (Scan)

- 1 Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ during playback on the remote.
- When you find the point you want to play back while scanning, press ► to return to normal speed.
 Fast forwarding or reversing stops and returns to the normal playback when the track goes to the next track or previous track.

Each time you press \blacktriangleleft or $\triangleright \triangleright$ while scanning, the scanning speed changes. With each press, the indication changes as shown below. Actual speeds may differ between discs.

Searching for a title/chapter/track, etc. (Search mode) DVD-V

You can search a DVD by title or chapter, and you can search a VIDEO CD by track. As titles and tracks are assigned unique numbers on the disc, you can select the desired one by entering its number.

1 Press DISPLAY on the remote.

The following display appears. The number in parentheses indicates the total number of titles, tracks, etc., of the disc.



Press ⇔ /⇔/☆/∜ repeatedly to select a search method on the remote.

When playing a DVD VIDEO/DVD-RW TITLE CHAPTER

When playing a VIDEO CD TRACK

3 Select the number of the title, chaper, track, time code, etc. you want by pressing the numeric buttons to select the digit.

The Unit starts playback from the selected number or time.

To turn off the display

Press DISPLAY on the remote repeatedly until the display is turned off.

Notes

- The title, chapter, or track number displayed is the same number as that of recorded on the disc.
- You cannot search for a scene on a DVD+RW using the time code.

Using Various Additional Functions

The following operations are set up using the remote while looking at a TV screen.

Selecting the audio DVD-V

Switches the language of the sound track.

Press AUDIO on the remote while playing a disc. Each time you press AUDIO on the remote, the language of the sound track changes.

Note

Depending on the DVD VIDEO, you cannot change the audio setting even if multilingual audio are recorded on the disc. In this case, use the DVD's menu (page 24).

Selecting the subtitles DVD-V

If subtitles are recorded on the disc, you can change the subtitles, or display or hide them whenever you want, while playing a DVD.

Press SUBTITLE on the remote while playing a disc. Each time you press SUBTITLE on the remote, the subtitle of the DVD changes.

If you want to hide the subtitle from the TV screen, press SUBTITLE on the remote until the display shows SUBTITLE OFF on the TV screen.

Note

Depending on the DVD VIDEO, you cannot change subtitles even if multilingual subtitles are recorded on the disc. In this case, use the DVD's menu (page 24).

Selecting the angle DVD-V

You can change the angles even if various angles (multiangles) for a scene are recorded on the DVD VIDEO. When "Angle Mark" is set to "ON" in the setup display, angle mark is displayed on the TV screen (page 29).

Press ANGLE on the remote while playing a disc. Each time you press ANGLE on the remote, the angle of the DVD changes.

Parental control (limited playback) DVD-V

The following operations are set up using the remote while looking at a TV screen.

The "PARENTAL CONTROL" function allows you to set a playback limitation level.

Playback of some DVD VIDEOs can be limited according to a predetermined level, such as the age of the users.

1 Press DVD SETUP on the remote when the Unit is in stop mode.

The Setting Menu appears.

When you select "ON," and various angles (multi-angles) for a scene are recorded on the DVD VIDEO, an angle mark is displayed on the TV screen. The default setting is "ON."

OSD Lang (On-Screen Display Language) Switches the display language on the screen.

Captions

The hidden subtitle is displayed or turn off. The default setting is "ON."

Screen Saver

The screen saver image appears when you leave the Unit in pause or stop mode for five minutes. The screen saver will help prevent your display device from becoming damaged (ghosting). Press any button to turn off the screen saver.

The default setting is underlined.

Presetting Radio Stations



Listening to Sound from a Component Connected to LINE IN



Chapter 6 Using the System Network

This chapter describes how to use network functions among Units and computers, etc. You can enjoy music, and use the intercom and the monitor function connecting each of the Units via an Ethernet cable.

Playing Music on Other Units

You can play back and share the music content in all Units and computers via an Ethernet cable. There are two types of source used to play back music content. One is "NETWORK," and the other is "MY MUSIC." If a computer is connected to the Internet, you can get the CD information from the Gracenote CDDB® server.

Playing back music from "NETWORK"

When you select "NETWORK," audio CDs on other Units and MP3-format music files on your computer are played back.

1 Press the "NETWORK" SELECT on the Home Menu. The Room list appears.

3 Press any SELECT to select a track to be played back.

The playback display appears, and playback starts.

Notes

- Each Unit appears with an original name if you have changed the name of the Unit. See "Naming the Unit" on page 12 for details on how to change the names of Units.
- When using network music, some of the functions or the access to the other Units are restricted.
- Some music files stored on the hard disk of your computer may not be able to be played back on the Unit. For example, depending on file format, some music files may not be played back on the Unit.

Continue to the next page

Playing back music from "MY MUSIC"

When you select "MY MUSIC," audio CDs in other Units and MP3-format music files from your computers are played back.

When the Unit has been connected to the Internet via a computer, CD information, such as artist name, album and track titles, or genre, are downloaded from the Gracenote CDDB[®] server, and sorted into "TITLE," "ARTIST," "ALBUM," and "GENRE." These information appear on the front panel display.

You can select and play back desired tracks from these lists. When the Unit is not connected to a computer or your computer is not connected to the Internet, only "TRACK1," "TRACK2," etc., appear on the front panel display.

1 Press the "MY MUSIC" SELECT on the Home Menu. The Browse list appears.



2 Press any SELECT to select a list from "TITLE," "ARTIST," "ALBUM," "GENRE," or "PLAYLIST."* The selected list appears.

If you select "TITLE," a Track list appears. Skip to step 4.

- * If you press "TITLE," "ARTIST," "ALBUM" or "GENRE" SELECT, each list is sorted and appears based on the CDDB information. If you press "PLAYLIST" SELECT, the playlist registered using the Utility In-Wall Unit software on the computer appears.
- **3** Press any SELECT to select an artist, genre, or a playlist title according to the list you select in step 2.
- 4 Press any SELECT to select a track to be played back.

The playback display appears, and playback starts.

Various play mode functions (Shuffle play, Repeat play)

"NETWORK" and "MY MUSIC" have two play modes.

Shuffle play

You can play back tracks in random order. For details on "Shuffle play" see page 21.

Repeat play

For details on "Repeat play" see page 21.

If you select "ALL DISC" during NETWORK playback, the Unit plays tracks on the disc randomly. When the disc finishes, it selects the next disc to be played back at random.


Enjoying Music in All Rooms Simultaneously (Party mode)

Using the Party mode function, you can share the music content among multiple Units simultaneously. You can also exclude a selected room from the Party mode (Party Privacy).

Source and play modes available in the Party mode are the following:

- NETWORK/MY MUSIC
 - CDs inserted into Units in which the Party Privacy is set to off.
 - MP3-format music files stored on the hard disc drive of a computer.
- CD/DVD
 - CDs (when using a CDP-NW10)
 - CDs, Data CDs (MP3) (when using a DVP-NW50)
- A device connected via LINE IN
- Sound output from a device connected via LINE IN.Tuner
 - A station currently tuning in.
- 1 Press MODE after selecting a source on the Home Menu.

The Mode Menu appears.



e.g. When you press MODE while playing a CD.

2 Press the "PARTY" SELECT.

"Party" appears on the right side of the top line on the front panel display.

The Unit enters the Party mode, and music is output to the rooms.

In the Party mode, some playback operations such as stop, play, etc., are operable on all of the Units.

To cancel the Party mode

You can cancel the Party mode from any of the Units even if the Unit is not in the Party mode.

Press the highlighted "PARTY" SELECT on the Mode Menu using the same procedure you used when you activate the Party mode.

Excluding the Unit from a Party mode (Party Privacy)

If you set the Party Privacy in a selected Unit, you can operate that Unit individually even if other Unit is in the Party mode.

The setting is retained even if you turn off the Unit.

Talking with Persons in Other Rooms (INTERCOM)

You can talk with person in any room using the Intercom function. While INTERCOM is set to ON, the internal speaker is activated and speakers connected to the Unit are muted. The streaming on the network stops until the intercom connection is terminated on both of the sending and receiving rooms.

1 Press the "INTERCOM" SELECT on the Home Menu. The Room list appears.



2 Press any SELECT to select the room you want to contact.

If the room you want to contact is not displayed on the front panel display, press the " $\mathbf{\nabla}$ " SELECT to display the next page.


The INTERCOM display appears, and connection is established after the receiving room answers.



3 To cancel the intercom connection, press the "OFF" SELECT on the Intercom display.

To answer INTERCOM

- If there is no answer from the room you are trying to contact, the connection is terminated automatically in 10 seconds.

Any room in which the Intercom Privacy is set to ON, does not receive the Intercom signal.

- 2 Press the "▼" SELECT repeatedly until "INTERCOM PRIVACY" appears on the front panel display.





Using the Setup Display

You can set up the sound on the Unit.

2CH STEREO (2CH)

Outputs the sound from the front left and right speakers only. Standard two channel (stereo) sources completely bypass any processing. Multi channel surround formats are downmixed to two channels.

A.F.D. (AUTO FORMAT DIRECT)

Surround mode is decoded as it is recorded on the disc, without adding any effects (e.g. reverbertaion).

DOLBY PL (Dolby Pro Logic)

Performs Dolby Pro Logic decoding. A source recorded in 2 channels is decoded into 4 channels.

DOLBY PL II (Dolby Pro Logic II)

Performs Dolby Pro Logic II Movie decoding. This setting is ideal for movies encoded in Dolby Surround. In addition, this mode can reproduce sound in 5.1 channel when watching videos of old movies or with dubbed language.

To return to the previous display

Press BACK.

Note

When an input signal (e.g., multi channel, etc.) other than from a 2 channels source is input, "DOLBY PL" and "DOLBY PL II" are decoded into "A.F.D."

Adjusting the contrast of the front panel display (DIMMER)

 Press the "▼" SELECT on the Home Menu, then press the "SETUP" SELECT. The Setup Menu appears.





The balance can be adjusted ± 8 steps in left and right position.



Settings for Speakers (DVP-NW50 only)

To obtain the best possible surround sound, set the size of the speakers you have connected and their distance from your listening position. Then use the test tone to adjust the volume of the speakers to the same level.

Selecting a speaker size

Set the speaker size to match the size of the speakers you are using. This setting is concerned with bass management and downmix function. The list below describes the available settings for each of the speakers.

Sub Woofer (S.WOOFER)

Speaker Size	Function
YES	Select this if you have connected a sub woofer speaker.
NONE	Select this if you have not connected a sub woofer speaker.

Front Speakers (FRONT)

Speaker Size	Function
LARGE	Normally select this position. SMALL cannot be selected if sub woofer is set to "NONE."
SMALL	Select this when the speaker cannot reproduce adequate bass frequencies.

Center Speakers (CENTER)

Speaker Size	Function
LARGE	Normally select this position. LARGE cannot be selected if front speaker is set to "SMALL."
SMALL	Select this when the speaker cannot reproduce adequate bass frequencies.
NONE	Select this if you have not connected a center speaker.

Rear Speakers (SURROUND)

Speaker Size	Function
LARGE	Normally select this position. LARGE cannot be selected if front speaker is set to "SMALL."
SMALL	Select this when the speaker cannot reproduce adequate bass frequencies.
NONE	Select this if you have not connected a surround speaker.

- Press the "▼" SELECT on the Home Menu, then press the "SETUP" SELECT. The Setup Menu appears.
- 2 Press the "▼" SELECT repeatedly until "SP. SIZE" appears.
- **3** Press the "SP. SIZE" SELECT. The Speaker size setup Menu appears.

- Select the corresponding SELECT to select the speaker to be setup.
 The size of speaker is toggled as you press any SELECT as shown above.

Notes

- If you connect large speakers that will effectively reproduce bass frequencies, select "LARGE." Normally, select "LARGE."
- If the sound is distorted, or you feel a lack of surround effects when using multi channel surround sound, select "SMALL" to activate the bass redirection circuitry and output the front channel bass frequencies from the sub woofer.

About speaker sizes

Internally, the LARGE and SMALL settings for each speaker determine whether or not the internal sound processor will cut the bass signal from that channel. When the bass is cut from a channel the bass redirection circuitry sends the corresponding bass frequencies to the sub woofer or other "LARGE" speaker. However, since bass sounds have a certain amount of directionality it is best not to cut them, if possible. Therefore, even when using small speakers, you can set them to "LARGE" if you want to output the bass frequencies from that speaker. On the other hand, if you are using a large speaker, but prefer not to have bass frequencies output from that speaker, set it to "SMALL." If the overall sound level is lower than you prefer, set all speakers to "LARGE."

Setting the speaker distance

You must set the distance from your listening position to the speakers.

The available distance for a center and a surround speaker depends on that of the front speaker.

The next list shows the selectable distance value of each speaker. The list below describes the available setting for each of speakers. The default adjustments are in parentheses.

Speaker	Distance
FRONT (10 ft/3.0m)	Set this between 3 and 20 ft (0.9 m and 6.0 m) in 1 ft (0.3 m) increments
CENTER (10 ft/3.0m)	Set this between 3 and 20 ft* (0.9 m and 6.0 m) in 1 ft (0.3 m) increments.
SURROUND (10 ft/3.0m)	Set this between 3 and 20 ft* (0.9 m and 6.0 m) in 1 ft (0.3 m) increments.

* The setup value may be different depending on the setup value of the front speaker.



Chapter 9 Other Information

This chapter provides you with additional information that will help you understand and maintain your system.

Precautions

On safety

- CAUTION The use of optional instruments with this product will increase eye hazard.
- To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, on the apparatus.
- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the cabinet, unplug the Unit and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, causing death or serious injury. Attachment to a wall should not be performed by ungualifield persons.

Attachment and adjustment by ungualifield persons is dangerous and may cause an accident or cause the unit to fall.

Be sure to consign installation attachment and removal to a gualifield service technician.

On power sources

- The Unit is not disconnected from the AC power source as long as it is connected to the wall outlet, even if the Unit itself has been turned off.
- If you are not going to use the Unit for a long time, be sure to disconnect the Unit from the wall outlet. To disconnect the AC power cord, grasp the plug itself; never pull the cord.

On placement

- Place the Unit in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent heat build-up in the Unit.
- Do not place the Unit on a soft surface such as a rug.
- Do not place the Unit in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, or mechanical shock.
- Do not install the Unit in an inclined position. It is designed to be operated in a horizontal position only.
- Keep the Unit and the discs away from equipment with strong magnets, such as microwave ovens, or large loudspeakers.
- Do not place heavy objects on the Unit.

On cleaning

Clean the cabinet, panel, and controls with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder or solvent such as alcohol or benzine.

On cleaning discs

Do not use a commercially available cleaning disc. It may cause a malfunction.

Caution: This Unit is capable of holding a still video image or on-screen display image on your television screen indefinitely. If you leave the still video image or onscreen display image displayed on your TV for an extended period of time, you risk permanent damage to your television screen. Plasma display panel televisions and projection televisions are susceptible to this.

Troubleshooting

If you experience any of the following difficulties while using the Unit, use this troubleshooting guide to help you to remedy the problem. Should any problem persist, consult your nearest installer.

Power

The power is not turned on.

➡ Check that the AC power cord is connected securely.

Picture

There is no picture.

- ➡ The video connecting cords are not connected securely.
- ightarrow The video connecting cords are damaged.
- ➡ The Unit is not connected to the correct TV input jack (page 10).
- ➡ The video input on the TV is not set so that you can view pictures from the Unit.
- → Check the connection to your TV (page 10) and switch the input selector on your TV so that the signal from the Unit appears on the TV screen.

Picture noise appears.

- → The disc is dirty or flawed.
- → If the picture output from your Unit goes through your VCR to get to your TV, the copy-protection signal applied to some DVD programs could affect picture quality. If you still experience problems even when you connect your Unit directly to your TV, try connecting your Unit to your TV's S VIDEO input (page 10).

Even though you set the aspect ratio in "TV Type" of "General Setup," the picture does not fill the screen.

 \rightarrow The aspect ratio on the disc is fixed.

The picture is not displayed correctly. The Unit and the TV are not synchronized.

→ Check the "TV Type" setting in "General Setup" (page 28).

(TV in North America uses the NTSC color system).

Sound

There is no sound.

- → The speaker cord is not connected securely.
- → Check the speaker settings (Installer's manual).
- ➡ The connecting cord is damaged. Replace it with a new one.
- → Press MUTING on the remote if "MUTING" is displayed on the front panel display.
- ➡ Fast forward or fast reverse is performed. Press ► to return to normal play mode.
- \rightarrow The Unit input is not correctly set.
- ➡ The Intercom function or the Monitor function is active. Cancel the Intercom function or the Monitor function (page 38, 39).

The left and right sounds are unbalanced or reversed.

- → Check that the speakers and components are connected correctly and securely.
- → Adjust the balance parameter on the Setup Menu (page 43).

There is no sound from the sub woofer.

- ➡ Check the speaker connections and settings (Installer's manual).
- → Make sure that sub woofer is set to "YES" in the speaker setting (page 44).
- → Set the surround mode to "A.F.D" (AUTO FORMAT DIRECT) (page 42).

Severe hum or noise is heard.

- ➡ Check that the speakers and components are connected securely.
- → Check that the connecting cords are away from a transformer or motor, and at least 3 meters (10 feet) away from your TV set or a fluorescent light.
- ightarrow Move your TV away from the audio components.
- ➡ The plugs and jacks are dirty. Wipe them with a cloth slightly moistened with alcohol.
- \rightarrow Clean the disc.

The sound loses stereo effect when you play a VIDEO CD, a CD, or an MP3.

→ Make sure the Unit is connected appropriately.

The surround effect is difficult to hear when you are playing a multi channel source such as Dolby Digital sound track.

- → Check the speaker connections and settings (Installer's manual).
- Depending on the DVD, the output signal may not be the entire 5.1 channel. It may be monaural or stereo even if the sound track is recorded in Dolby Digital format.

The sound comes from the center speaker only.

→ Depending on the disc, the sound may come from the center speaker only.

No sound is heard from the center speaker.

→ Check the speaker connections and settings.

No sound or only a very low-level sound is heard from the surround speakers.

- → Check the speaker connections and settings.
- ➡ Make sure the rear speakers are set to either "SMALL" or "LARGE" (page 44).
- → Make sure the surround mode function is on (page 42).
- → Depending on the source, the effect of the surround speakers may be less noticeable.
- ➡ The sound volume is low on some DVDs. The sound volume may improve if you set "DRC" on the Setup Menu to "OFF" (page 46).

Network

The Unit cannot detect any other Units nor computers.

- → Network cable is disconnected. Check the network cable connections.
- ➡ An IP address or a Sub-net mask is not set properly. Check the LAN settings on the IP address setup Menu (page 11).
- → A router is turned off. Check the router power condition.

Cannot talk with other room during Intercom.

- ➡ Intercom Privacy is set to on. Set it to off.
- ➡ Connection has not been established. Press the "ANSWER" SELECT (page 38).
- → The volume level is low. Press +VOLUME to adjust the volume.
- → Other Units have been using Intercom. Wait for a while until Intercom is available.

Cannot monitor other rooms.

- → Monitor Privacy is set to on. Set it to off.
- ➡ The volume level is low. Press +VOLUME to adjust the volume.
- ➡ Other Units have been using Intercom. Wait for a while until Monitor is available.

Cannot get track title while listening to music from NETWORK or MY MUSIC.

➡ The PC application is not running. Start the PC application on your computer.

Audio reception is interrupted or distorted.

- ➡ The network does not have enough bandwidth. Check to see if the network cable supports 100BASE-TX or not.
- → The network cable, network switch, or router device may not support 100BASE-TX. Check to see if the router device supports 100BASE-TX or not.

Operation

The remote does not function.

- \rightarrow The batteries in the remote are weak.
- ➡ There are obstacles between the remote and the Unit.
- → The distance between the remote and the Unit is too far.
- ➡ The remote is not pointed at the remote sensor on the Unit.
- ➡ The remote code switch setting on the remote does not match the setting on the Unit.

Radio stations cannot be tuned in.

- → Check that the antennas are connected securely. Adjust the antennas or connect an external antenna if necessary.
- ➡ The signal strength of the stations is too weak (when tuning in with automatic tuning). Use direct tuning.
- ➡ No stations have been preset or the preset stations have been cleared (when tuning by scanning preset stations). Preset the stations (page 31).

The remote does not function.

- → There are obstacles between the remote and the Unit.
- ➡ The distance between the remote and the Unit is too far.
- ➡ The remote is not pointed at the remote sensor on the Unit.
- \rightarrow The batteries in the remote are weak.

The disc does not play.

- \rightarrow There is no disc inserted.
- ➡ The disc is upside down. Insert the disc with the playback side facing the Unit.
- ➡ The disc is skewed.
- \rightarrow The Unit cannot play certain discs (page 8).
- ➡ The region code on the DVD does not match the Unit.
- → Moisture has condensed inside the Unit. Remove the disc and leave the Unit turned on for about half an hour.

The MP3 audio track cannot be played.

- ➡ The DATA CD is not recorded in an MP3 format that conforms to ISO 9660 Level 1/Level 2 or Joliet.
- ➡ The MP3 audio track does not have the extension ".MP3."
- ➡ The data is not formatted in MP3 even though it has the extension ".MP3."
- ➡ The Unit can only play MP3 (MPEG1 Audio Layer3) audio.
- ➡ The Unit cannot play audio tracks in MP3PRO format.

The disc does not start playing from the beginning.

- Shuffle Play, or Repeat Play has been selected (page 21, 23, 24).
 Cancel Shuffle Play, or Repeat Play (page 21, 23, 24).
- → Resume Play has been selected. During stop, press ■ on the remote and then start playback (page 22, 23).
- ➡ The title, DVD or PBC menu automatically appears on the TV screen.

Playback stops automatically.

➡ Some discs may contain an auto pause signal. While playing such a disc, the Unit stops playback at the auto pause signal.

The Unit turns off during DVD playback.

→ The Sleep Timer turned off the Unit at the preset time (page 41).

Some functions such as Stop, Search, Repeat Play, or Shuffle Play cannot be performed.

➡ Depending on the disc, you may not be able to perform some of the operations above. See the operating manual that came with the disc.

Troubleshooting (continued)

The language for the sound track cannot be changed.

- ➡ Multilingual tracks are not recorded on the DVD being played.
- → The DVD prohibits changing the language for the sound track.

The subtitle language cannot be changed.

- ➡ Multilingual subtitles are not recorded on the DVD being played.
- → The DVD prohibits changing subtitles.

The subtitle cannot be turned off.

→ The DVD prohibits turning off subtitles.

The angles cannot be changed.

- → Multi-angles are not recorded on the DVD being played (page 29).
- \rightarrow The DVD prohibits changing angles.

A disc cannot be ejected and "LOCKED" appears on the front panel display.

➡ Contact your Sony dealer or local authorized Sony service facility.

"PROTECT" appears on the front panel display.

- → The speaker protection circuit is functioning.
- ightarrow Check the speaker connections.

The Unit does not work normally.

→ If the Unit's operation becomes effected, press
 I/⁽¹⁾ (POWER) on the Unit to turn off the power, then turn on the power again.

Error Messages

If any of the messages below appear on the front panel display of the Unit, check the following table to solve the problem. If any problem persists, consult your nearest Sony dealer.
