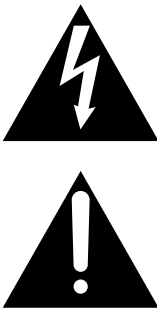

## Getting started

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# PRECAUTIONS

Before using this unit please read these operating instructions carefully. Take special care to follow the warnings indicated on the unit itself as well as the safety suggestions listed below. Afterwards keep them handy for future reference.

## Safety


- Power Source**—The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the unit. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.
- Polarization**—If the unit is equipped with a polarized AC power plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), that plug will fit into the AC outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- Power Cord Protection**—AC power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. Never take hold of the plug or cord if your hand is wet, and always grasp the plug body when connecting or disconnecting it.
- Overloading**—Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- Nonuse Periods**—When the unit is not being used, turn the power off. When left unused for a long time, the unit should be unplugged from the household AC outlet.

## Installation

### Environment

- Water and Moisture**—Do not use this unit near water—for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, swimming pool, or the like. Damp basements should also be avoided.

  - immediately after a heater has been turned on.
  - in a steamy or very humid room.
  - when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one. If moisture forms inside this unit, it may not operate properly. To correct this problem, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.
- Heat**—The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators and the like. It also should not be placed in temperatures less than 5 °C (41 °F) or greater than 35 °C (95 °F).

### Placement

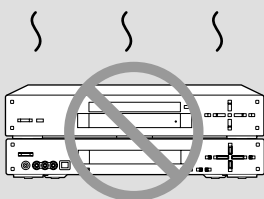
- Ventilation**—The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. Allow 10 cm (4") clearance from the rear of the unit.
- Foreign Material**—Care should be taken so that objects do not fall into and liquids are not spilled into the unit. Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, or shock.
- Carts and Stands**—The unit should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer. The unit and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the unit and cart combination to overturn.

## Maintenance

# Connection

## Notes

- Never plug the power cable to a household AC outlet until all connections are complete.
- Please refer to the manuals of other equipment as necessary to make the best connections.

## Audio connection



Video connection

This unit equips three types of video jacks as follows:

**1. VIDEO jack**

This jack transmits conventional composite video signal. Connect this jack to your AV amplifier so that you can switch the both audio and video inputs at once.

**2. S VIDEO jack**

This jack transmits color and luminance separately and achieves high quality color reproduction. Connect this jack to your television using a commercially available S-Video cable. If your AV amplifier equipped with S VIDEO input and output jacks, connect to the AV amplifier so that you can switch the both audio and video inputs at once.

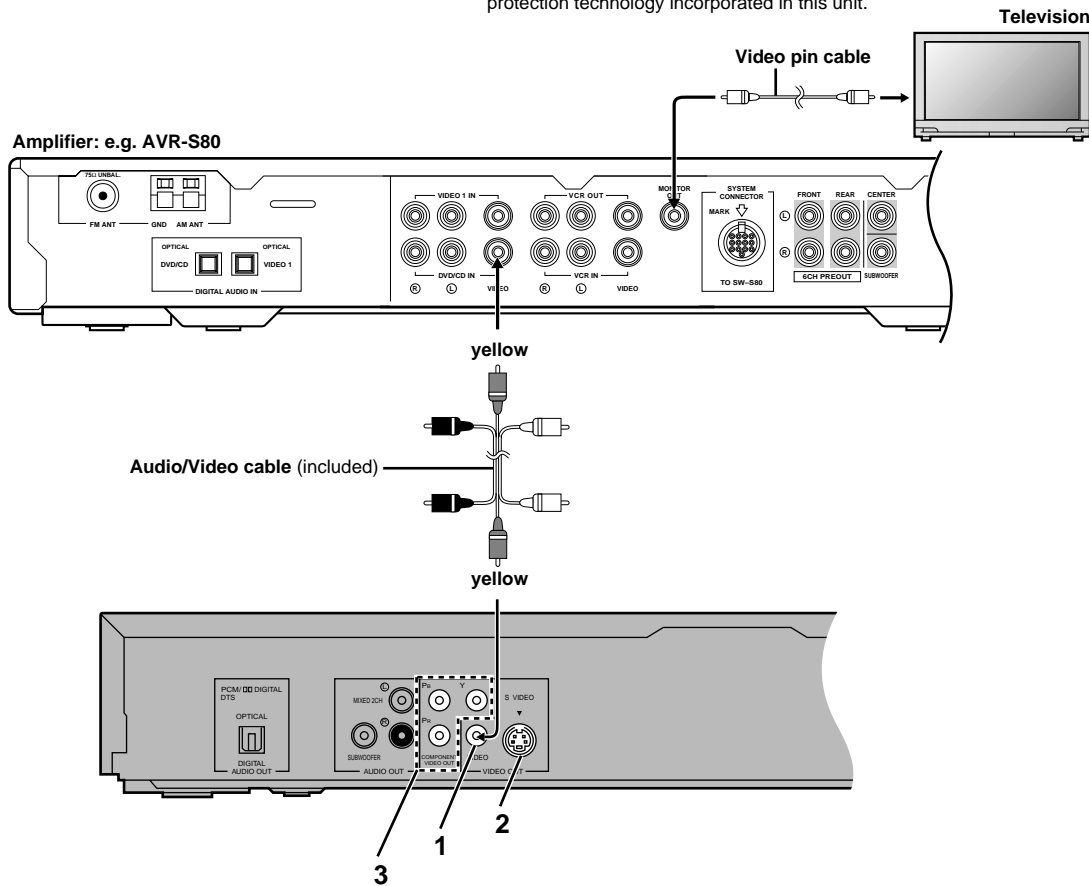
**3. COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks**

These jacks transmit color difference and luminance separately and provide the best quality picture. Connect these jacks to the corresponding jacks of your television. If your AV amplifier equipped with COMPONENT VIDEO input and output jacks, connect to the AV amplifier so that you can switch the both audio and video inputs at once.

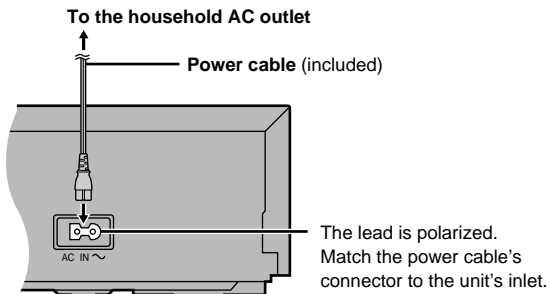
- After making this connection, change the black level for a better picture (➔ page 16, Video—Black Level Control).

**Note**

Do not connect this unit to a television through a video cassette recorder. If you do so, the picture may not be played back properly due to the copyright protection technology incorporated in this unit.



Connecting the power cable



Plug the power cable into the AC IN when all connections are complete, and then plug this unit to the household AC outlet.

**Caution**

Do not use other AC power cables than the one provided. Otherwise it may result in causing fire or an electrical shock.

**To enjoy 5.1-ch surround sound**

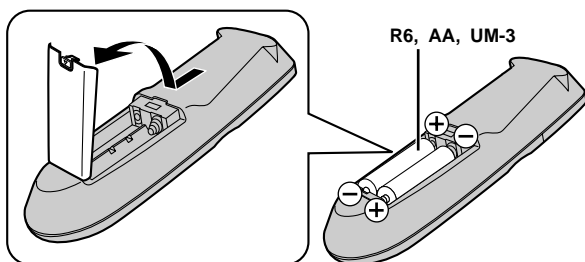
- Change the settings in "Digital output" to suit the equipment you connect (➔ page 17).

**Note**

You cannot use DTS Digital Surround decoders not suited to DVD.

# The remote control

## ■ Batteries



- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

## Do not:

- mix old and new batteries.
- use different types at the same time.
- heat or expose to flame.
- take apart or short circuit.
- attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

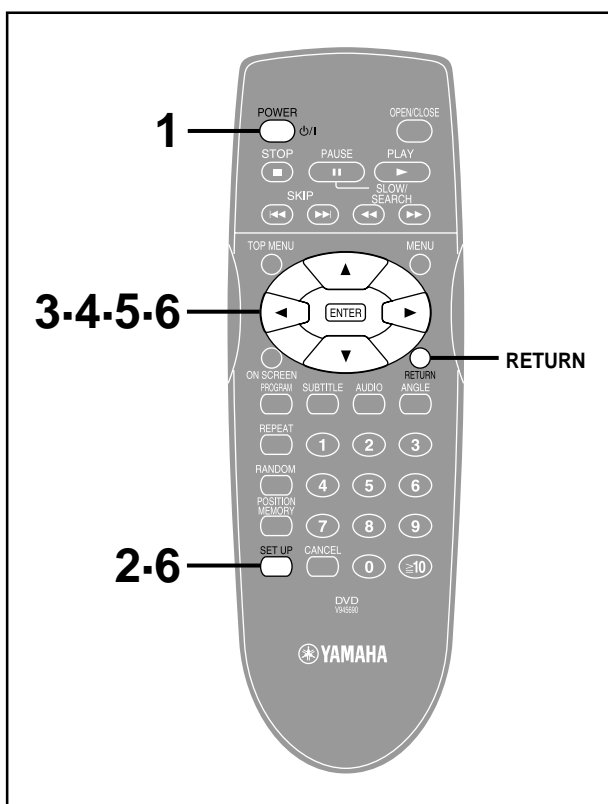
Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

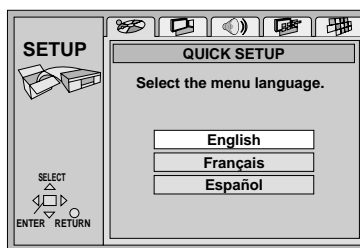
## ■ Use

Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m (23 feet) directly in front of the unit.

## QUICK SETUP



- 1 Press [POWER  $\text{\textcircled{I}}$ ] to turn on the unit.
- 2 Press [SET UP] to show the QUICK SETUP screen.



- 3 Press [ $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\blacktriangledown$ ,  $\blacktriangleleft$ ,  $\blacktriangleright$ ] to select the menu language and press [ENTER].
- 4 Press [ $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\blacktriangledown$ ] to select "Yes" to continue and press [ENTER].
- 5 Press [ $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\blacktriangledown$ ,  $\blacktriangleleft$ ,  $\blacktriangleright$ ] to select the item and press [ENTER].
  - Audio Language (For setting details  $\Rightarrow$  page 16)
  - Subtitle Language (For setting details  $\Rightarrow$  page 16)
  - TV Aspect (For setting details  $\Rightarrow$  "TV Aspect" below)
- 6 Press [ENTER] and then [SET UP] to end the settings.

**To return to the previous screen**  
Press [RETURN].

## ■ TV Aspect

Select "4:3" (regular) or "16:9" (widescreen) to suit your television.

If you have a regular 4:3 television, you can also select how video on some discs is shown ( $\Rightarrow$  page 16, Video—TV Aspect).

### • 4:3 Pan&Scan (Factory preset)

The pan and scan (the original widescreen images are converted for viewing on a regular television) version of the video is automatically selected if recorded on the disc.



### • 4:3 Letterbox

The letterbox (the original widescreen images appear with black bands above and below) version of the video is automatically selected if recorded on the disc.

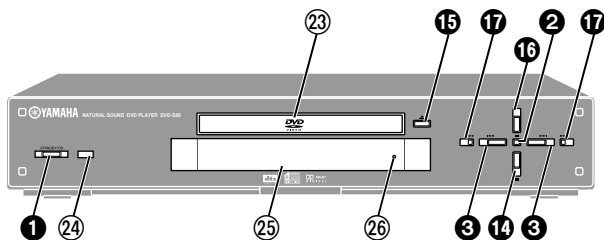
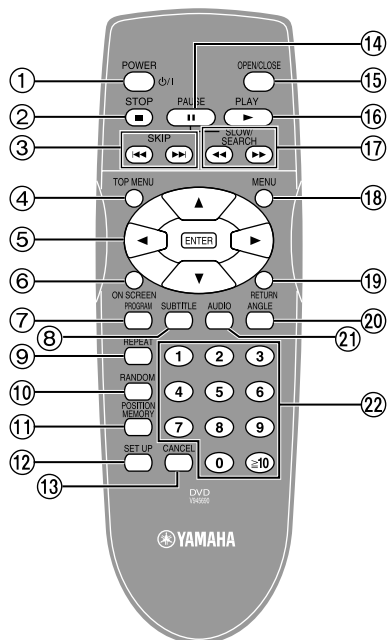


## Remote control only

The **QUICK SETUP** screen appears when you press [SET UP] the first time after purchase and assists you to make necessary settings. You can access this screen again later if you need to ( $\Rightarrow$  page 16, Others—QUICK SETUP).

## Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the player.



Buttons such as ❶ function the same as the controls on the remote control.

- ❶ Standby/on switch (POWER  $\odot$ /I) ..... 6  
Press to switch the unit from on to standby mode or vice versa.  
In standby mode, the unit is still consuming a small amount of power.

Operations in these instructions are described mainly with the remote control, but you can do the operations on the main unit if the controls are the same.

### Region number supported by this player

Region numbers are allocated to DVD players and software according to where they are sold.

- The region number of this player is "1".
- The player will play DVD-Video marked with labels containing "1" or "ALL".

### Discs that cannot be played

DVD-Audio, PAL discs, DVD-ROM, DVD-RAM, CD-ROM, CDV, CD-G, +RW, DVD-RW, CVD, SVCD, SACD, Divx Video Discs and Photo CD.

### DVDs that can be played

This unit has a Dolby Digital decoder so you can play DVDs with this mark.

This unit does not have a DTS decoder. Connect this unit to equipment that has a DTS decoder to enjoy DVDs with this mark.



### Playing DVDs and Video CDs

The producer of these discs can control how they are played so you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions. Read the disc's instructions carefully.

### CD-R and CD-RW discs

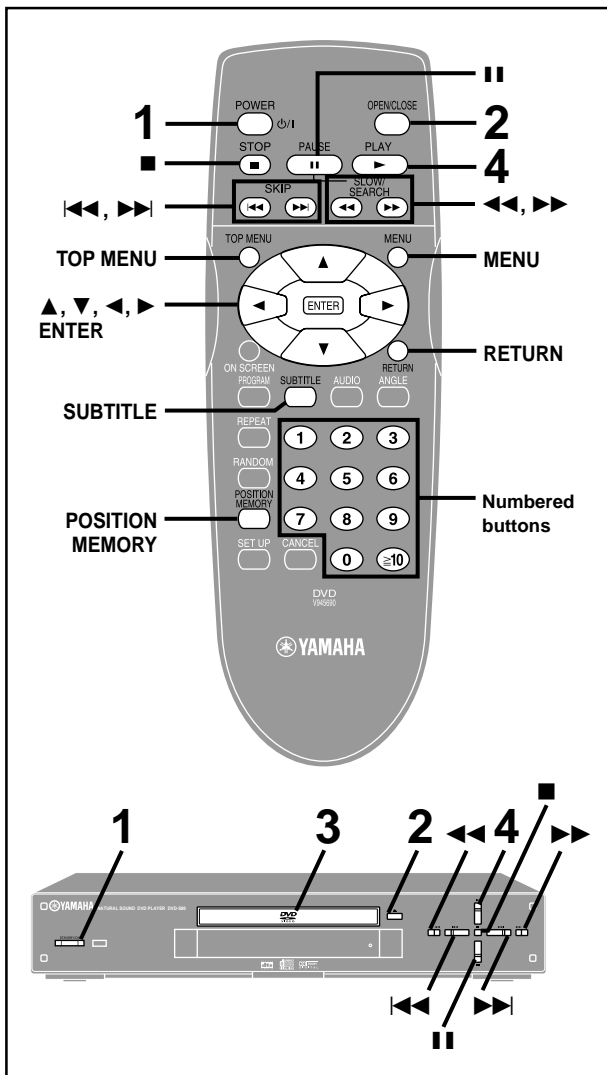
This unit can play CD-DA (digital audio) and video CD format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized (a process that enables CD-R/CD-RW players to play audio CD-R and CD-RW) upon completion of recording. It may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW due to the condition of the recording.

### DVD-R discs

It may not be possible to play these discs in all cases due to the type of disc or condition of the recording.

### Handling precautions

- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs. (Do not use discs with exposed adhesive from tape or left over peeled-off stickers.)
- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.
- Do not use discs printed with label printers available on the market.



### To stop play

Press [■] (→ page 9, Resume function).

### To pause play

Press [⏸] during play.

Press [▶] (PLAY) to restart play.

### ■ Auto standby

The unit switches to standby mode after about 30 minutes in the stop mode.

### Notes

#### ● If "⊙" appears on the television

The operation is prohibited by the unit or disc.

● The disc continues to rotate while the menu is displayed even after you finish playing an item. Press [■] when you finish to preserve the unit's motor and your television screen.

● Volume may be lower when playing DVDs than when playing other discs or during television broadcasts.

If you turn the volume up on the television or amplifier, be sure to reduce the volume again before playing other sources so that a sudden increase in output does not occur.

### When a menu screen appears on the television

DVD-V VCD

### Remote control only

### Press the numbered buttons to select an item.

#### To select a 2-digit number

Example: To select item 23, press [≧10] → [2] → [3].

● When playing DVDs, you can also use [▲, ▼, ◀, ▶] to select items. Press [ENTER] to confirm your selection.

Play of the selected item now begins.

### Other buttons used to operate menus

Read the disc's instructions for further details about operation.

[▶▶]: Shows the next menu.

[◀◀]: Shows the previous menu.

[RETURN]: Shows the menu screen. VCD

[TOP MENU]: Shows the first menu screen. DVD-V

[MENU]: Shows the menu screen. DVD-V

### Starting play from a selected title or track

DVD-V CD VCD

### Remote control only

### Press the numbered buttons to select the item.

#### To select a 2-digit number

Example: To select track 23, press [≧10] → [2] → [3].

CD (MP3 discs)

Press [ENTER] after pressing the numbered buttons.

(You do not have to press [≧10].)

Play starts from the selected item.

### Note

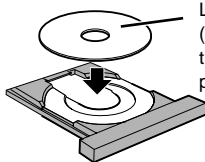
This works only when stopped with some discs.

DVD-V CD VCD

### Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the player.

- 1 Press [POWER ⏻] to turn on the unit.
- 2 Press [OPEN/CLOSE] to open the disc tray.
- 3 Place the disc on the disc tray.



Label must face upward.  
(With double-sided discs, load so the label for the side you want to play is facing up.)

- 4 Press [▶] (PLAY).

The disc tray closes and play begins.

CD (MP3 discs)

Group and track names are displayed on the television.

Press [SUBTITLE] to turn the display on or off.



## Skipping chapters or tracks

DVD-V CD VCD

During play or while paused  
Press [**⏮**] or [**⏭**].

- Each press increases the number of skips.

## Fast forward and rewind—SEARCH

DVD-V CD VCD

During play  
Press [**⏮**] or [**⏭**].

- Audio will be heard during search. You can turn this audio off if you want to (➔ page 16, Audio—Audio during Search).

## Slow-motion play

DVD-V VCD

While paused  
Press [**⏮**] or [**⏭**].

## Frame-by-frame viewing

DVD-V VCD

### Remote control only

While paused  
Press [**⏮**] or [**⏭**].

The frame changes each time you press the button.

- The frames change in succession if you press and hold the button.
- Pressing [**⏮**] also activates forward frame-by-frame.

### Notes

- The speed of search and slow-motion increases up to 5 steps.
- Press [**▶**] (PLAY) to restart play.
- You cannot move backwards with Video CD during slow-motion and frame-by-frame.

### When playing Video CDs with playback control

Pressing buttons to perform skip, search or slow-motion may take you to a menu screen.

## Resume function

DVD-V CD VCD

(When the elapsed play time is displayed)

The position you stopped play at is recorded by the unit when “▷” is flashing on the display.



While “▷” is flashing, press [**▶**] (PLAY) to start play from where you stopped it. (When playing DVD ➔ Chapter Preview below)

- The position is cleared when the disc tray is opened or the unit is switched to standby.
- Press [**■**] to clear the position.

## Position Memory function

### Remote control only

This function allows you to memorize a position to start from even after switching the unit to standby or changing discs.

1. During play, press [POSITION MEMORY].
2. Press [POWER ⏻/⏼] to switch the unit to standby, or press [OPEN/CLOSE] to remove the disc.
3. When you are ready to play the disc again, press [**▶**] (PLAY). Play starts from the memorized position and the position is cleared. (When playing DVD ➔ Chapter Preview below)

Position memorized

### To clear the position before play

Press [**■**] before recalling the memorized position.

- You can memorize positions on up to five different discs at a time. When you memorize another position, the earliest position is replaced.

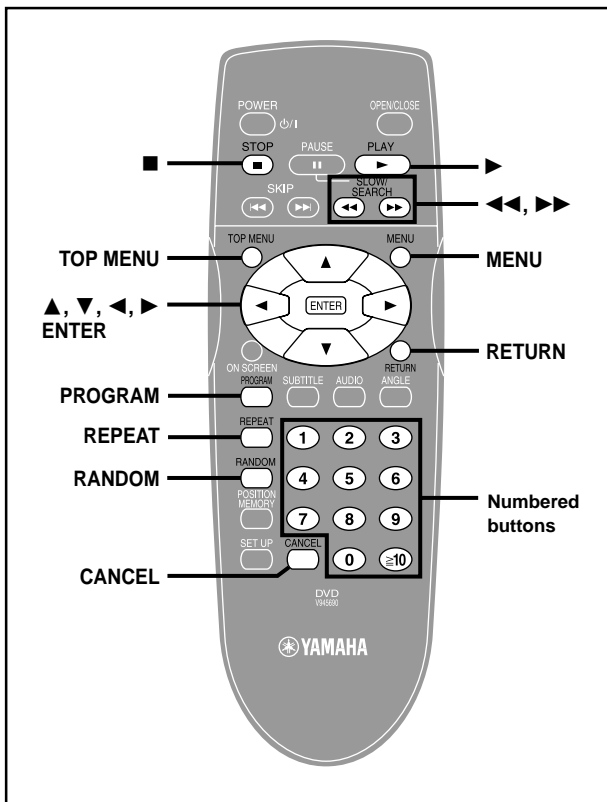
## Chapter Preview DVD-V

The following message appears immediately after you press [**▶**] (PLAY).

Press PLAY to Preview Chapters

Press [**▶**] (PLAY) while the message is displayed and the beginning portions of each chapter up to the current one are played. Full play resumes from the point where you pressed [**■**] or [POSITION MEMORY]. (This feature works only within a title.)

If you do not press [**▶**] (PLAY), the message disappears and play starts from where you pressed [**■**] or [POSITION MEMORY].

(When the elapsed play time is displayed)

## Repeat play

**Remote control only**

**During play**

**Press [REPEAT].**

Each time you press the button:

**DVD-V**

Chapter (C) → Title (T)\* → OFF

**CD** **VCD**

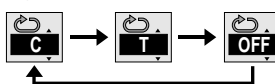
Track (T) → Entire disc (A) → OFF

**CD** (MP3 discs)

Track (T) → Group (G)\* → OFF

\*"All (A)" during program and random play.

e.g. DVD-Video



**If the Video CD has playback control**

1. Press [■] during play until "PBC PLAY" is cleared from the display.
2. Press the numbered buttons to select a track to start play (⇒ page 8).
3. Press [REPEAT] (⇒ above).

**Note**

You cannot use repeat play to repeat an entire DVD or an entire MP3 disc.

## ■ To repeat only your favorite tracks

Start program play (see right) and press [REPEAT] to display "A".

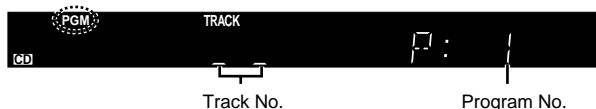
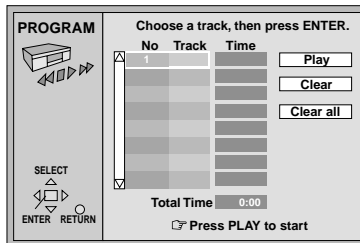
## Program play

**Remote control only**

You can select up to 32 tracks/chapters to play in the order you choose.

**While stopped**

1. Press [PROGRAM].  
e.g. CD



2. **DVD-Video, MP3 discs only**  
**Press the numbered buttons to select a title (DVD-Video) or group (MP3 discs).**
  - Some items cannot be selected.
  - Different titles have different soundtracks and subtitles.
3. **Press the numbered buttons to select a track (CD or VCD) or chapter (DVD-Video) (and, for MP3 discs press [ENTER]).**
  - Repeat steps 2 and 3 to program other items.
  - **To select an item using the cursor buttons**  
Press [ENTER] and [▲, ▼] to select an item, then press [ENTER] again to register the number.  
All the items on a disc, a title or a group are selected when you select "ALL".
  - Times are not displayed when programming DVD-Video and MP3.
4. **Press [▶] (PLAY).**  
Play now begins in the programmed sequence.
  - Some items cannot be played even if you program them. **DVD-V**

**To add or change items**

Press [▲, ▼] to select an available item, then repeat steps 2 and 3.

**To move to the page before or after the one shown**

Press [◀◀] or [▶▶].

**To clear the programmed items one by one**

## Glossary

## Bitstream

This is the digital form of multiple channel audio data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

## Decoder

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

## Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be 5.1-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

## Dolby Pro Logic

A surround system where a 4-channel audio track is recorded as 2 channels and then is restored to 4 channels for play. The surround channel is monaural and can reproduce up to 7 kHz.

## DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

## Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

## Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that go together to make a moving picture. There are about 30 frames shown each second.

One frame is made up of two fields. A regular television shows these fields one after the other to create frames.

A still is shown when you pause a moving picture. A frame still is made up of two alternating fields, so the picture may appear blurred, but overall quality is high. A field still is not blurred, but it has only half the information of a frame still so picture quality is lower.

## I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

## I: Intra coded picture (I-picture)

This is the standard picture and is a complete picture in itself. This means it has the best picture quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.

## P: Predictive coded picture (P-picture)

This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.

## B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture (B-picture)

This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

## Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs.

## Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus (called menu play in these instructions).
