

2. PANEL FACILITIES AND OPERATION



SPEED SELECT LEVER

Either of two speeds, 33-1/3 rpm or 45 rpm, can be selected by this lever. Change the position only while the turntable is rotating.

33 When playing a 33-1/3 rpm record.

45 When playing a 45 rpm record.

TO NEARM

This tonearm is designed to apply the correct tracking force to the cartridge and to keep this force at precisely the right level for faithful tracking of the record grooves. It also has the job of switching the power on to the turntable.


ARM-ELEVATION LEVER

▲ ... UP: When this lever is set to this position, the tonearm will rise. Set it to UP before record play and when you want to stop record play while a track is being played or when you want to change over to a different track.


▼ ... DOWN: When the lever is set to this position, the tonearm will be lowered. If it is set to DOWN for record play the tonearm will be lowered onto the surface of the record, and play will begin.

ARM REST

The arm rest supports the tonearm. As illustrated in the figure, use the clammer to keep the tonearm in place when you are not playing records.

4. DISASSEMBLY

4.1 Tonearm

1. First remove the 4 screws ① ~ ③, ⑮ securing the under board.
2. Then remove the 2 screws ④ ~ ⑤ holding the microswitch.
3. Also remove the 2 screws ⑥ ~ ⑦ holding the shield cover.
4. Use a soldering iron to disconnect the 6 leads from the terminal strip (1L4P).
5. Then remove the screw ⑧ securing the terminal strip.
6. Next use a hexagonal wrench to remove the 4 screws ⑨ ~ ⑫ securing the arm base.
7. Also remove the screw ⑬ holding the PU plate.
8. Finally, remove screw ⑭, again using a hexagonal wrench. The tonearm may now be gently lifted out.



4.2 Motor

1. First remove the speed selector lever ① (pull straight out).
2. Also remove the belt.
3. Then remove the 5 screws ② ~ ⑤, ⑫ securing the motor base.
4. Remove the under board as described in step 1 under the "Tonearm" section above, and then

disconnect the motor leads from the terminal strip, using a soldering iron as shown in Fig. 2 (inset).

5. Remove the screw ⑥ holding the shifter base.
6. Finally remove 3 E-type washers ⑦ ~ ⑨ holding the motor plate, and the 2 screws ⑩ ~ ⑪ securing the motor to the motor plate.




